# Lochside Community Collective

## TERMS OF REFERENCE

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of the Lochside Community Collective is to:

- Identify and support the development of community-led projects that benefit local residents:
- Partner with Wheatley Homes South, Dumfries and Galloway Council and others to help shape and deliver the Lochside Masterplan;
- Promote co-design by involving residents in the planning and delivery of community initiatives; and
- Act as a trusted forum for community engagement and communication.

### 2. Status

The Collective is an unconstituted community group. It does not have legal status, a constitution or a bank account. It operates as a voluntary partnership to support community coordination and advocacy.

#### 3. Membership

Membership will include:

• Up to 10 Lochside residents.

One representative from each of the following local organisations:

- Lochside and Woodlands Community Council;
- Lochside Community Association;
- LIFT Dumfries and Galloway;
- YMCA Dumfries;
- Langlands School Parent Council;
- North West Community Campus Primary School Parent Council;
- North West Community Campus Secondary School Parent Council; and
- St Teresa's RC Primary School Parent Council.

#### And:

- Two senior pupils from North West Community Campus Secondary School;
- North west Dumfries youth councillors;
- North west Dumfries councillors.

The group may invite additional individuals or organisations to attend meetings or contribute to specific projects as appropriate.

#### 4. Meetings

Meetings will be held monthly or as agreed by the group;

- Meetings will be informal, but minuted, with agendas shared in advance; and
- Interim roles such as Chair and Secretary may be appointed to facilitate coordination.

#### 5. Decision-Making

- Decisions will be made by consensus, where possible;
- Where consensus cannot be reached, a majority vote will be used; and
- All members will have equal standing in discussions and decision-making.

## 6. Scope of Activities

- Facilitating communication between residents and partners;
- Promoting and enabling co-design in regeneration and community projects;
- Supporting local groups in identifying funding opportunities; and
- Advising on and supporting the implementation of the Lochside Masterplan.

#### 7. Review

These Terms of Reference will be reviewed annually to ensure they remain relevant. Changes must be agreed upon by the group.
